Wall Painting Conservation Principles

It has become clear that it is critical to review the principles formulated more than two decades ago to ensure they align with current standards. The document will be assessed for clarity of writing, its underlying ethical framework, and its relevance.

Global Mapping of Mural Painting Education

The working group for the Global Education Mapping Survey aims to provide a thorough overview of and training initiatives education related to mural painting conservation. Young conservators will be able to learn from the experience of veteran conservators about techniques and materials for conservation of murals. In addition, the bibliographic database will strengthen and develop the connection between the conservators.

Sílvia Llobet

Sílvia holds a degree in Art History from the University of Barcelona and Conservation from ESCRBCC (Higher School of Conservation and Restoration of Cultural Assets of Catalonia). She is currently a conservator at the Center for the Restoration of Movable Property of the Generalitat of Catalonia (CRBMC), coordinator of the department for archaeological materials (Valldoreix, Barcelona).



Pere Rovira

Pere holds a degree in Conservation from the University of Barcelona. He is currently a conservator at CRBMC, and a specialist and coordinator of the department of mural paintings and stone sculpture (Valldoreix, Barcelona).



Mercè Marquès

Mercè holds a PhD in Conservation from the University of Barcelona. Specialist in mural painting. Head of KROM, a company for the conservation and restoration of mural painting, and associate professor in the Bachelor's degree in Conservation-Restoration of Cultural Heritage at UB (University of Barcelona).



Sílvia Yagüe

Sílvia holds a PhD in Conservation from the Polytechnic University of Valencia, with studies at the Opificio delle Pietre Dure (Florence) and a degree in Conservation from the University of Barcelona. She is a freelance restorer, specialist in mural painting. Associate professor in the Bachelor's degree in Conservation-Restoration of Cultural Heritage at UB (University of Barcelona).







Detachment Discussion

Brainstorming Session on the Practice of Mural Painting Detachment

During this session, ISCMP members and CRBMC representatives will reflect on the use of detachment in mural painting conservation, building on case studies presented by CRBMC. Detachment—the removal of mural paintings from their original supports—was once a common preservation method but is now reassessed in light of contemporary conservation ethics.

Both ICOMOS ISCMP and CRBMC, consistent with their guiding principles, do not endorse the use of detachment. However, the practice is still ongoing, and many paintings remain in museums and storage facilities following this intervention. Special attention in the discussion will be given to works that underwent these interventions in the past, recognizing the particular challenges this previous treatment poses in their conservation. Drawn from diverse historical and technical contexts, the CRBMC case studies will provide a foundation for meaningful dialogue and shared understanding.

Guided by their combined professional experience, technical expertise, and ethical awareness, ISCMP and CRBMC leaders will frame a discussion on the broader implications of detachment. The first session will introduce the topic and the second seeks to develop a shared international framework that supports responsible, context-sensitive decision-making around detachment in mural painting conservation.
